## **R.A. Horn Student Award and Franklin B. Walter Educator Award nominations now being accepted**

## About the R.A. Horn Award:

The R. A. Horn award is presented to one exemplary special education student from each of Ohio's 16 State Support Team regions. This award was established 25 years ago by the Ohio Department of Education in honor of the late Dr. Raymond A. Horn, Assistant Superintendent of Public Instruction Emeritus. This prestigious award recognizes students' remarkable performance. Acknowledged as a national leader in the field of special education, Dr. Horn devoted more than 60 years of service to improving the quality of life and learning for students with disabilities. Dr. Horn left behind a legacy and a challenge to ensure that every student with a disability be given the respect and the opportunities to which they are entitled.

## About the Franklin B. Walter Award:

The Franklin B. Walter award is given to an educator or team from each of the 16 State Support Teams in Ohio who have made extraordinary contributions to the education of students with disabilities. This award is given in honor of the late Franklin B Walter, Superintendent of Public Instruction from 1977 until 1991, a post held longer than any other state superintendent in Ohio's history. With over 50 years of service as a teacher and administrator, Dr. Walter's leadership is evident in many of Ohio's quality educational initiatives and programs. Among these is the development of the nation's first statewide plan for children with disabilities.

We have streamlined the application and encourage you to nominate for both awards. All nominees will be recognized, with details to follow. State Support Team 2 would like to recognize as many deserving nominees as possible. Please consider nominating a student or teacher from your school district or program.

With new standards and expectations for teachers, that challenge has become more daunting than ever. We are excited that you are using the resources available from the FIP Your School Ohio team to help you through these transitions.

Are you looking to put what you're learning into action? We can help. We are very pleased to present you with new learning opportunities created for a variety of audiences and subject matters, designed to give you a customizable and personal learning experience. Your learning will connect to OTES and OPES expectations and can be part of your Individual Professional Development Plan (IPDP). These tools are all available free to Ohio educators. Take a look at what we've been working on.

**Designing Sound Assessment Modules:** The modules in this series will enable you to become more efficient at measuring, monitoring, and adjusting learning. In addition to demonstrating how to create sound assessment items and tasks, the series shows you how to make wider use of assessment as a teaching and learning tool.

<u>Measuring Student Growth</u>: Learn how to classify levels of mastery, plan and create pre- and post-assessments that capture where students enter and exit their learning, and understand how the Student Learning Objective process can be used to cultivate student ownership in the classroom.

The <u>Reaching Every Student module series</u> complement the existing modules by providing relevant learning for those who teach English Language Learners, students with disabilities, and gifted students.

# "Expect Success! Understanding and Supporting Behavioral Challenges" Forming *Second Cohort* for Supporting Students with Significant Behavioral Needs

The multi-day series, designed to help building and district teams support students with significant behavioral needs, is a tremendous success! State Support Teams from Region 2 and 3 worked together with behavioral experts from the Ohio Center for Autism and Low Incidence (OCALI) to help educator teams, from four counties, hone their skills to better support students with challenging behavioral needs.

This 4-day series is conducted over several weeks to allow educator teams to use the in-depth process to address a specific student's, with whom they are familiar, behavioral concerns. The teams examine data around the child's behavior and look for patterns in addressing the question, "What is the function of this child's behavior?" Teams then use this data to begin the process of replacing those negative behaviors with more appropriate ones. The series is extremely in-depth and includes much more than a Functional Behavioral Analysis (FBA) might address.

Although the presenters are from OCALI, this series is certainly not limited to addressing the behavioral needs of students on the autism spectrum. The training is designed to assist educators in supporting students who exhibit those Tier 2 and 3 behavioral challenges. The dates for the Expect Success Cohort 2 training are:

- February 3, 2015
- March 5, 2015
- April 9, 2015
- May 21, 2015

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Two of the trainings will be conducted at the Cuyahoga County ESC and two will be held at the Lorain County ESC.

#### Purpose:

#### Guidelines:

- Each nominee must be currently employed as an educator by a public school district, a chartered nonpublic school, a state operated program, or a county board of DD in Erie, Huron or Lorain counties. Nominees may include certified and non-certified staff members.
- Nominators must complete the two forms attached and should provide specific information about the educator(s) in a typed description of;
  - A. The impact the nominee(s) have had on the quality of life and learning for children with disabilities.
  - B. How the nominee(s) is/are an exceptional candidate(s) for this award.

# FORMATIVE INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICES

The research is clear—using high-impact formative instructional practices (FIP) in the classroom translates to

great gains in student achievement.

The research-grounded practices known as formative assessment or assessment for learning have been around for more than a decade. While the practices are not new, the term formative instructional practices (FIP) comes from formative assessment research. The term was coined by Battelle for Kids to emphasize the interaction between curriculum, instruction, and assessment that we have found to be essential to the success of these practices. When implemented with fidelity, FIP equips teachers to successfully adapt to changes in the education environment.

Battelle for Kids, in collaboration with experts in the field of assessment literacy and research-based practices, have developed professional training resources on Formative Instructional Practices (FIP). These resources allow for independent and collaborative team learning in an online format. The facilitation guides help educators deepen the skills needed to effectively use formative instructional practices to improve outcomes for all students. FIP connects to the Ohio Improvement Process (OIP) closely, in that, close monitoring of formative assessment practices and impact of those practices on student learning is at the heart of every teacher-based team (TBT) meeting.

To access the FIP website and learning modules, it is best to **create a username/password** to be able to enter "my portal" to access all of the functionality of Battelle for Kids (BFK)'s website. You will likely need to **email** the provided **support** inbox for an access code, and you need your **Ohio Teacher's Certificate** for the following step.

There is a video concerning the FIP program on the homepage, an overview brochure and several pages to select on the left side of the screen.

On the left, there are several online learning module opportunities. There are currently five "foundation modules", a "leading and coaching module" with "application modules" available for all grade levels and content areas, including P.E.


