Early Childhood is an important time to help young children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) develop critical language and learning skills. The Ohio Center for Autism and Low Incidence (OCALI) has developed an online course that includes video examples in homes and preschool classrooms to introduce evidence-based strategies that can be used in natural environments during typical routines and activities of toddlers and preschoolers. Module topics include:

- Characteristics of autism
- Joint attention strategies
- Prompting
- Reinforcement
- Priming
- Emotional regulation
- Data collection

SST 2 is offering an opportunity for early childhood educators, assistant teachers, related services providers, and families to complete these modules in a combination of three face-to-face meetings and independent work.

Participants will receive 18 Ohio Approved contact hours, pending upon completion of the series. Participants will attend an initial three-hour overview and two follow-up meetings plus complete nine modules online.
